**YES** on Proposition 1:  
**Affordable Housing Act**

A yes vote authorizes \$4 billion to expand affordable housing programs



**NO** on Proposition 6: **Attack on Road Safety and Public Transit**

A no vote opposes the Republican-led attack on \$5 billion secured in 2017 for road and public bus repairs



**YES** on Proposition 2:  
**Affordable Housing for Homeless**

A yes vote authorizes \$2 billion to prevent homelessness and those at risk of being homeless



**NEUTRAL** on Proposition 7: **Legislative Vote to Eliminate Daylight Savings Time**

Allows for a 2/3rds legislators' vote to eliminate Daylight Savings Time change

**YES** on Proposition 3:  
**California Water Bond**

A yes vote authorizes \$8.9 billion for water projects and infrastructure to benefit communities without access to clean and safe drinking water



**YES** on Proposition 8: **For-profit Dialysis Regulation and Patient Protections**

A yes vote imposes penalties on the for-profit dialysis industry for excessive charges and prohibits patient discrimination based on type of payment



**YES** on Proposition 4:  
**Children's Hospital Bond**

A yes vote authorizes \$1.5 billion to expand hospitals serving children in low-income communities and communities of color



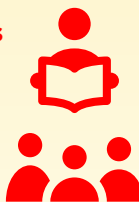
**YES** on Proposition 10: **Repeal California Ban on Rent Control**

A yes vote repeals harmful Costa Hawkins Rental Housing Act and allows communities to expand rent control locally



**NO** on Proposition 5: **Protect Funds for Schools and Communities**

A no vote ensures \$2 billion is not lost for schools and local communities by increasing tax breaks for older, wealthier Californians at the expense of other younger or less affluent homeowners



**NO** on Proposition 11: **Ambulance Worker Protection**

A no vote prevents for-profit ambulance companies from requiring emergency medical responders to remain on call during breaks



**NEUTRAL** on Proposition 12:  
**Farm Animals Cruelty Act**

Enacts new requirements to provide more space for farm animals and would ensure all animal products sold in California meet these requirements
